The Christmas Tree

Have you ever really looked at your **Christmas Tree**?

In every house, in every town and every city it can be seen. It is drawn on cards and is on display in shop windows. In the middle of a cold and barren winter, it stands tall and strong and unfailingly green. While other trees are lost of leaves, while plants recede into the ground, while buds hide and wait below frost and snow, and the land lies dull as if dead or dying, the evergreen Christmas tree is a symbol of hope, a promise of new life, a assurance of victory of life over death.

And what of the **decorations** on the tree? - the baubles, glimmering and sparkling, catching the light as they move gently in their place. They claim our attention, so perfectly formed, like small worlds, yet so frail, so needful of our care. They remind us of the universe created by God, full of colour and beauty, yet so fragile - held in place by the strand of God's love. This is the universe which Christ came to save.

And the **lights** flash in their places, small candles, only pinpricks in the darkness now - but they represent a much greater Light. They remind us that the child whose birth we celebrate is the Light of the World, who has come to cast away the darkness of the night, and light the way for us to the place where darkness vanishes for ever.

And on the tree we often find an **angel** - a messenger from heaven, who proclaims the coming of the Saviour to the lowly Virgin and who reminds us of all the heavenly host, who surprise the shepherds and sing the glory of the one who is born.

And with the angel - or even without the angel - there is usually a **star**. Bold, dominant and commanding the scene. A reminder of another star. And another place. A star which points to heaven - and marks a place on earth. A star which says that this humble place is where heaven touches the earth, where divine and human meet, where God dwells with men, where the word becomes flesh.

One Prisoner's Christmas Gift

One remarkable feature of our parish is that three of our parishioners work as prison chaplains. Their work not only has an impact on the lives of those who are serving time, but the inmates themselves are also able to contribute to the life of our parish too.



Here is just one example - Tony (not his real name) - as told by one of our prison chaplains.

When Tony was fifteen, he got a job selling something that makes you feel good for a short while, and by the time he was 23, Tony was running his own business. His success, however, was short-lived.

The police shut down Tony's business, the courts confiscated everything he owned and he was sent to prison for fourteen years.

I met Tony when he told me that he wished he had never stopped going to church and would I mind if he started coming to Mass in the prison? Two weeks later he made his first Confession in about fifteen years.

Tony asked me permission to miss Mass one week because there was a pottery class on and he'd always wanted to try it. A year later, he sent some sculptures to national competitions.

Hopefully by Christmas, you'll see the finished work in all its glory.

Planned Giving

Gift Aid

If you are a tax payer you can **Gift Aid** the tax you have paid, back to the parish. This means that for every £10 you give, the government will add a further £2.50. Only a small amount of paperwork is necessary. You can register for Gift Aid when you make a donation at cannock.mydona.com, or with a form available from Church.

Cashless collections

It would be a great help to the Parish if most parishioners paid your collection money by Standing Order. The Bank now charges us for paying in cash, while standing orders, especially with Gift Aid, would bring extra, and regular, money into the parish.

Notes for Saturday & Sunday Readers

When it is Family (School) Mass, Readers' rota may change.

Please check that what you are reading matches with the Mass Sheets. Also check if the Psalm and Gospel acclamation are being sung.

When there are two readers, one reads the First Reading and Psalm. The other reads Second Reading, Gospel Acclamation and, if there is no Deacon, the Bidding Prayers.

The second reader should also introduce the **Communion Antiphon**, which follows the bell, which immediately follows the priest's communion.

Each time, the two readers should swap roles, but can arrange otherwise. If there is only one reader - please read everything!

If you are reading the Bidding Prayers please approach the lectern **before** the end of the Creed, so that you are already in place before the priest begins the Prayers, and **stay** at the lectern until the priest has concluded them.

Notes for Ministers of the Eucharist

At each mass, ministers assists the priest, deacon or sister. If the minister on the rota is not present, please be ready to come forward to assist.

Please approach the altar after the peace and during the "Lamb of God". Purify hands with water if provided. (and sanitise). The priest or deacon will give you communion and the paten (plate/dish) with the sacrament. Stand at one side of the altar as appropriate (priest usually in the middle). Return the paten to the altar after communion.

Notes for Stewards

Welcome people to church - assist as necessary, including with sanitiser etc if requested. Please hand out Newsletters and Sheets, please collect in mass sheets at end for the following day (people may take them home if they want to).

Use the bags to invite a collection before and after each mass. Direct visitors to the Digital Collection Plate (card machine) as they enter the Church, and assist them if necessary.

Please ensure the security of bags and return them to sacristy after mass.

THE NEW LECTIONARY

A new edition of the Lectionary, the book which contains the readings which are proclaimed at Mass, will come into use in England and Wales in Advent 2024. The new edition uses the English Standard Version - Catholic Edition for the readings, and the Abbey Psalms and Canticles for the Responsorial Psalms. Here are the answers to some frequently asked questions.

Are there changes to the readings?

This is a new publication of the Lectionary using different scripture translations — the content remains the same. So, for the reading for each Sunday will be the same.

What's new?

There will be provision for Saints who have been added to the Calendar since the last Lectionary was published in 1981. In addition, some of the revised liturgical rites, such as Marriage, have additional readings.

Will the text be compulsory?

Yes. From Advent (December 2024) this text must be used in England, Wales and Scotland.

When will the Lectionary published?

Parishes have already started ordering their copies of the Lectionary. Copies are expected to arrive in parishes during October.

How many volumes are there?

The current Lectionary (1981) is in three volumes. The new Lectionary, however, will be in four volumes: One notable change is that all the readings will be given in sense lines and verse numbers as an assistance to the reader. This means that readings will require more space, so more pages.

Will I need a new Sunday Missal?

The words and prayers of the mass will not change, but the translation of the readings will differ. Many people may wish to get a new Sunday or Weekday Missal, especially if they read at mass or like to follow the reading as they are read in Church.



Is this going to be expensive?

Each parish will need the four main books, which will cost about £200 each. Each book comes with Bookplates to be inscribed with the names of donors or in memory of someone.

What about the Mass Sheets we use at mass, and readings online?

Providers of these services are already preparing new materials. The new readings will come into use when they are available.

What is this new translation, the English Standard Version - Catholic Edition?

The English Standard Version is the latest in a series of English translations which go back to the 16th Century. These translations have all been based on a 'word for word' principle. The ESV is directly based on the Revised Standard Version which was used in many Churches prior to 1981. Small changes have been made to modernise the language and reflect the latest scholarship.

What are the Abbey Psalms and Canticles?

The familiar responsorial psalms - the Grail Psalms - have been part of Liturgy in English for almost 70 years, even before the mass was celebrated in English.

In 2008 a revision of these texts was undertaken by the monks of Conception Abbey, Missouri. These texts eventually received confirmation from the Holy See. This text is now known as *Abbey Psalms and Canticles*, and will be used in future liturgy texts in English.
